Maths Enrichment

This week's Enrichment theme was 'Treasure Hunts (use of QR Codes)- 'Gathering Data through all senses'! The Treasure Hunts were a fantastic opportunity to engage the boys in meaningful way to consolidate and test the understanding of a topic. It never ceases to amaze me how much a little competition can engage boys with the range of abilities! The competitive element was definitely injected into this task which I don't think had anything to do with the mention of a prize at the end!

The Maths Trails/ Treasure Hunts also gave the boys an opportunity to develop their problem solving, reasoning and fluency skills, through a kinaesthetic approach to learning. The use of ICT and QR codes enhanced the activity as the data was readily available and feedback was instantaneous. The boys had to employ a range of mathematical skills and called upon all their senses to gather their data. The boys certainly agreed that there was a direct correlation between the avenues that were available to reach the data and their ability to solve the task; which ensured the cementing of key skills and conceptual understanding of a range of topics.

They boys had to use all their senses to cook pumpkin soup. They put the pumpkin soup in the slow cooker to taste later it the day.



Homemade Vegetable Soup is available daily. Varieties include Mushroom, Tomato, Parsnip and Cauliflower. A variety of **Fresh Fruit** is also available every day

In addition to the menu items detailed above we always offer a vegetarian main meal option.

We have a daily choice of fillings for **Jacket Potatoes** and wholemeal or white **baguettes**, also including a vegetarian option.

Ham, Cheddar Cheese and baked beans are available every day with both Tuna Mayonnaise and Coronation Chicken offered on occasion. Our **Salad Bar** has a wide selection of ingredients including green salad leaves, tomatoes, beetroot, sweetcorn and coleslaw. Additionally there may be Italian Sun Dried Tomato and Mozzarella salad, a Greek Salad with Olives and other seasonal specialities.

Break time snacks of ham or cheese sandwiches, fruit or vegetables should only be brought in to school in named, reusable containers. A reminder that no nuts or sesame seeds in any product, including bread, should be brought to school. No plastic wrapped items, please.

MORNING DROP OFF

The staff car park is clearly marked with a blue sign as one way in a clockwise direction. **Please** follow this route. If you drive the wrong way round it causes a tail back on the road and makes it difficult for pedestrians to cross the road.

The front crescent is only to be used to drop boys off, please move right forward to the front and **DO NOT** stop by the gate as this causes a hold up back onto the main road, if you need to park to see your son in **please** use the back gate.

AFTERNOON PICK UP

Please do not park out the front of the school to pick up your son as this makes it difficult for the minibus and taxis.
