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Educational Visits/Trips and Outings

School trips are an extension of school activities and part of the curriculum. Safety and good discipline are vital. School rules are applied to ensure the control and discipline of the boys.

In keeping with our broad curriculum and culture of 'a preparation for life beyond the school gate', it is an expectation that pupils will attend all trips, including residential trips, throughout the year unless there is a very significant mitigating reason approved by the Divisional Head.

Normally every class goes on at least one educational visit a year. You will be asked to sign a parental consent form on joining that allows travel locally and to away matches without specific permission every time. On longer trips we will send out a letter to inform you of the details and cost of the trip and ask that you return the slip only if you **do not** give permission for your child to attend. We adhere to the DfE's guidelines on ratios of adults to children depending on their age group and any coach company that is used has regulation seat belts fitted, as do the school minibuses. All trips are risk assessed.

Minibuses

The school operates five morning minibus runs that transport the children to school each morning. We also operate two afternoon runs. One bus leaves school at 5pm on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday to Esher and the other at 4pm on Monday, Thursday and Friday to Putney. Details of the bus runs are kept by the School Secretary and any queries from parents should be directed to her at office@kingswoodhouse.org.

Only children in Years 3-11 are allowed on the minibus runs except in exceptional circumstances and with the Headmaster's permission.

Kingswood House Association

The Parents' Association (KHA) is a valuable and important part of our school. It raises funds for the School and organises social events that many parents enjoy. Each family pays £10 membership annually on the school fees. Officers are elected at each AGM, and we welcome new members. Among the usual calendar events are the fireworks night, summer ball, sporting dinner and "Jollies" (school fete).

Links with the Community

Kingswood House School has a good relationship with the local community, based on the desire to establish links with both industry and local people. In fact, many of our staff and parents are from the direct locality. Various schools and local groups use our facilities, some regularly. We have links with local shopkeepers, schools and churches and our neighbours are invited to social events.

Years 9, 10 and 11 are involved with the local community through the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme.

We also have regular visits from the local Police School Liaison Officers and vicar. Classes have been taken to old people's homes to sing or perform plays, and there are also trips to Horton Farm and Country Park. The local recreation ground is used for sport and we hold the Carol Service and other assemblies and services during the year at Christ Church.

Holiday Activities – Kingswood Active

Staff hold regular Activity Courses in the holidays featuring a variety of sporting and fun activities, art and craft and computing. Details will be sent home in advance or email kingswoodactive@kingswoodhouse.org for more information.

Bags

The School has a standard issue games bag and rucksack that are available from the School Office.

Pupils must leave these rucksacks in designated areas in their classrooms when not in use. They should only contain the books relevant to the next two lessons on the timetable or for prep.

Otherwise, books should be carefully stored in lockers or shelves in classrooms.
