Dear Parents

I trust you enjoyed a relaxing Christmas holiday with your families.

It is a great pleasure to see the boys and girls back in school this morning at the start of what promises to be a busy and exhilarating spring term, notwithstanding the well-documented challenges we may face. Thank you to Mrs Witts and her team who oversaw Lateral Flow Testing this morning for Years 7-11 in arctic temperatures! We are committed to maintaining as normal an educational experience as possible for the pupils within the parameters of government guidance and the potential for us to safely maintain a healthy staff ratio within the school.

First and foremost, I offer a warm welcome to Miss Lana Sumners who joins us as a second form teacher in Year 5 for the rest of the academic year and to Mr Mark Farmer who brings considerable energy and experience to the mathematics department. In the Study Centre, Ms Ilse Roets and Mrs Sue Jones will also add greater depth to the Study Centre team of tutors in numeracy and literacy respectively. I wish them a long and prosperous association with the school.

Over the holiday, you may have seen in the news about the sad death of **Sir Richard Rogers**. A former pupil at KHS, Sir Richard was an unconventional learner and found many aspects of his schooling a great challenge – yet he blossomed into one of the world's most eminent architects, with the Millennium Dome and the Pompidou Centre amongst a dazzling array of other achievements which feature prominently on a glittering CV. I wrote a short tribute about Sir Richard from the school, which can be found together with his obituary from The Times, on our website.

In my Headmaster's Assembly this morning, as is customary in January, I highlighted the significance of New Year as an apposite time for reflection and ambition. I challenged the children to make up their own **New Year resolutions** and set themselves some attainable targets for the months ahead. Please do take the time to discuss this with them together with the advice that evidence suggests an effective resolution typically helps others, not just themselves, in some way. For better or worse, I shared my own resolution – to try and do more cooking – although this may be a poisoned chalice for my family in more ways than one! You are encouraged to share

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any of your own examples, backed up by evidence, which will then likely find their way into the weekly “Mentions in Dispatches”!

In the near future, there are some natural opportunities for new, good habits to be put into practice. Our Year 11 cohort has important mock GCSE examinations over the next week or two whilst a small number of Year 6 pupils have impending 11+ pre-tests. There will also be school examinations for Year 8 after half term, which will help determine their GCSE options, as well as Year 10 for a check on their progress ahead of making applications to sixth forms in the new academic year. All of the teaching and support staff wish our students the very best of luck in these endeavours.

The **Kingswood House Way** character value for this term is INTEGRITY. Some of the key aspects of this quality, which we shall be exploring in more depth with the pupils, are loyalty, trust and empathy. We have fantastic ‘character’ badges, originally designed by Ruari Fitzpatrick, which are handed out each term and I hope to award a number of these sought-after badges to deserving candidates.

The **Subject Enrichment** focus for this half of term is Science. You will receive more information about some exciting opportunities in this subject from Miss Black. After the half term, the focus moves onto ICT and Sports. We will also hold a mufti day, with the theme of ‘Favourite Characters’, for **World Book Day** on Thursday 3rd March – so get your thinking hats on for some interesting costumes!

Parking

There continues to be some pressure in respect of parking in and around the School, especially at pick up time. Please act with consideration for other drivers, pedestrians and especially our neighbours. Naturally, it would be helpful if all parents were punctual, especially whilst the end of the school day is still dark, and you should not arrange to collect your child unsupervised from the car park. Please do collect a KHS car sticker for your vehicle from the school office if you do not already have one on display. I am due to meet again with the traffic councillor, and host local residents later this term, in order to work in partnership with them so any evidence I can show about how the school is addressing their comments will be invaluable.
