






Learning about Spike!

Menna went on to become a competitive skier and in September 2015, she started working with British Army Captain Jen Kehoe as her sight guide, to great success. Hopes were high for similar successes in their second season together, but in October of the 2016/17 season, Menna fell during training and broke four bones in her hand. Getting back to full fitness and speed was incredibly hard for Menna but each attempt helped to push her further towards her goals; she achieved a Silver medal at the 2022 Beijing Paralympics—a true show of endeavour...

Senior Lecture—Years 7—10, Thursday 16th June, 5pm-5.45pm Langlands

This term's Senior Lecture which will be held face-to-face will be delivered by Simon Minty, a public speaker who focuses on disability. His work involves helping improve the portrayal of disabled people in media with BBC, Channel 4, Warner Television and Endemol Shine. He won Best Television Feature in 1999 for his Channel 4 Travelog documentary in China.



He performed in and co-produced the sell-out Edinburgh Fringe comedy show *Anormally Funny People* in 2005, returning in 2015. He co-hosts two podcasts, *BBC Ouch!* and *The Way We Roll with Minty & Friend*. Simon will be speaking to the pupils about diversity and difference, which he is a great advocate of. He will also speak to the pupils about his three heroes with disability, his history and experiences and will also enlist the help of Mrs Chandler in the kitchen (Simon's sister) to join him to talk about having a sibling with disability and their experiences of this growing up!



Please note that this is a compulsory event for all Seniors. Pupils may go to prep after lesson 6 or to town before the event. Pick up will be at 6pm from the bottom car park.

For Year 7 and 8 pupils only: We hope that the Year 7 & 8 pupils will be able to join us at this event as this will be an excellent pre-cursor to the co-curricular enrichment that is on offer in the Senior school.
