





We were delighted to hear of the following achievement by one of our Y11 pupils.

"Every September, the Great River Race runs; a 21.6 mile river rowing Marathon, which goes through the middle of the City of London on the Tidal Thames. This is not a race for the faint hearted. It is a full commitment to race under Tower Bridge, past the Houses of Parliament, through Wansdworth, Chiswick, Kew and then into Richmond. There is a time limit, you need to outpace the tide's turn and these are big, heavy boats. This is an international race, with crews from across Europe taking part.

However with the race due to take place less than 2 days after the death of Queen Elizabeth, it was clear that it could not run as normal. So, rather than race against each other, nearly 200 boats from across Europe rowed the course as the Queen Elizabeth 2nd Memorial Procession.

With black ribbons adorning boats, in the classic maritime mark of mourning; and with no timings or trophies; Joseph and his friends formed one of 4 Warpsite Sea Scout Youth Teams, all of whom completed the course under 4 hours - a significant achievement given the size & weight of their boats.










In Year 7 and 8's first Art lessons with Mrs Bastable they were asked the question

#### Respect

One of the most important values is Respect. Respect is a positive feeling or action shown towards someone or something considered important or held in high esteem or regard. Respect is such a predominant value. It ought to be used every day. From respecting your parents' wishes to the food on your plate, respect is crucial to being the politest version of yourself.

Queen Elizabeth II has passed away and the citizens of England are paying their respects by laying down flowers at the gates of Buckingham Palace and elsewhere, and the radio stations are playing sombre music. 



# Year 3 Topic Work
















Miss Wilson writes,






# Current Pedagogy in School





Designs and Technology in Action in Year 10...



playlist on Spotify that can be a starting point for discussion in form time with pupils.










After our staff and pupils had returned from their Berlin trip we were delighted to receive the following email communication from the tour operators, which commended the behaviour of the students:







It was highly enjoyable to be learning outside of the classroom, hands on, in the very mild Autumn weather!







## **Black History Month**

Black History Month was created to focus attention on the contributions of African Americans to the United States. It honours all Black people from all periods of U.S. history, from the enslaved people first brought over from Africa in the early 17th century, to African Americans living in the United States today. They commemorate it in February each year. Other countries have also adopted the idea from the USA, though in Britain we designate the month of October to its focus.



Mrs Haunstetter reports on the month's work in school...

"At KHS we have marked Black History Month this year in a number of ways, to help students recognise the impact that Black people have on all aspects of our lives. Miss Foster put together a play list of music and songs by Black musicians from a variety of genres, which we could all listen to during registration. Walter Tull was a professional footballer, who served as an officer in the First World War and was killed in 1918. Across Year 9, students were given the opportunity of researching one of twenty-eight British Black people who have contributed significantly to the 'Making of Modern Britain'. The list of twenty-eight personalities included not only historical

Proceedings of the second of the concepts of t

figures such as Ignatius Sancho (writer, abolitionist and ex-slave) and William Cuffey (Chartist), but well-known

contemporary trailblazers such as Nicola Adams and Sir Lenny Henry. Pupils got the chance to study less well-known, but highly influential individuals, such as Dr Paul Stephenson, who led the successful Bristol Bus Boycott which paved the way for the 1965 Race Relations Act. Another notable person on the list was Dame Linda Dobbs, the first non-white person to be appointed to the senior judiciary of England and Wales. Each pupil wrote a three-hundred-word biography on their chosen person, and these will appear in a small exhibition in the near future.

Finally, Nelson Mandela was remembered as a key figure from history for all that he achieved in South Africa, by Mr Sukhdeo in Senior Pupil Briefing, and it seems appropriate to conclude with some words from 'Madiba', "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."



On the whole, both teams played exceptionally well and did Kingswood House proud! Keep it up everyone.










#### Maths Enrichment—Magic in Year 3!

of the battle was longer than the classroom, though not quite as long as the real thing which is 70 metres! Mrs Haunstetter






#### Black History Month—updates



**Remembrance Day** will be commemorated on Sunday, and we will observe a two minutes silence; this was observed for the first time on Armistice Day in 1919 to honour the sacrifice of those who lost their lives in WW1. The original proposal was for a five-minute silence which was shortened following a trial with the Grenadier guards at Buckingham Palace.





Poppies are used to remember those who have given their lives in battle is because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War One ended. This is described in the famous World War One poem In Flanders Fields. On September 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of The American Legion family to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. Artificial poppies were first sold in Britain in 1921 to raise money for the Earl Haig Fund in support of ex-servicemen and the families of those who had died in the conflict. In 1924, the distribution of poppies became a national program of The American Legion.



"This week Year 6 looked at WW1 and WW2 poetry, and we read the story of Jack and George who joined up to fight in WW1 when they were very young. Just before the end of war George was killed and 79 years later Jack stood at his graveside in Northern France.

We looked at the poem <u>Dolce et Decorum Est</u>, which Wilfred Owen wrote in the trenches during WW1. The class then wrote their own war poems, keeping in mind all we had discussed. Well done 6S for producing some lovely work".



This week in enrichment lessons, Year 7 and 8 have looked at ANAMORPHOSIS which uses maths and art to create distorted pictures that can only be viewed from a particular angle. Using scale factors and angles pupils can create their own desired distorted image and that image only appears when viewed at the correct angle.

This type of art work is quite common in modern street art, but the concept dates as far back as the Renaissance with Leonardo da Vinci and also appears in paintings by Hans

Holbein—the most famous being a distorted skull floating in between the two court ambassadors—see right.







#### My Story—Something to Say

Ms Timothy was delighted to welcome Jeremy Indika to KHS on Tuesday; he presented to staff about his powerful story of childhood sexual abuse and lessons learned from it.



Jeremy was an incredibly eloquent speaker, with a background and early career in aerospace and mechanical engineering, and handled this personal, and difficult subject matter with great ease and sensitivity. His burning passion is to get into schools and youth settings where the taboo topics can be more openly discussed and dealt with. Mr Murphy commented: "I was very proud to welcome Jeremy to KHS where he delivered twilight training for staff; it is the first time that Jeremy has ever taken his personal story about sexual abuse into schools—but I feel it won't be the last. Once again, KHS is pioneering new ground for the benefit and well-being of children".

The four Sundays preceding Christmas day on the 25th, are recognized for four virtues, represented by the four candles on the advent wreath which symbolize hope, love, joy and peace, and the candles are lit in that order. The three purple candles in an advent wreath represent penance, the pink candle represents joyfulness.







Year 5 have used ratios to create a variety of colours by mixing the various primary colours red, blue and yellow in the clay. They have then used the colours made to create their own decoration.


Year 6 and 7 used a marble affect and have created congruent tiles so that they can then tessellate them into a festive design.






**Christ Church Carol Service**




