Did you know the following facts about Easter celebrations and traditions...?

Early Christians in Mesopotamia dyed eggs in the period after Easter. Eggs represent new life and rebirth, and it's thought that

this ancient custom was incorporated into Easter celebrations. The Chocolate egg started as a pagan symbol of fertility and Spring and developed into a representation of Christ's resurrection. The



first chocolate eggs were made in France and Germany in the early 19th Century.

Why is Good Friday called 'good' when it was actually the day on which Jesus died? Christians believe that it is called Good Friday because Jesus died so that everyone could be forgiven for the things they had done wrong, therefore it is the forgiveness which is good and not Jesus' death.



Why do we eat Hot Cross Buns? Thomas Rocliffe, a 14th Century monk is credited for making the first hot cross bun. They have now become synonomous with Easter celebrations. Each bun is decorated with a cross to represent the cross on which Jesus died, and the spices in hot cross buns are said to represent the spices that were used to embalm Jesus after his death.

If you live in France, you will see the tradition of 'Les cloches de Pâques'. From Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday the bells fall silent to mark the death of Jesus, and the bells fly to Rome to be blessed by the Pope. On Easter Sunday they return and drop chocolate eggs in the gardens for the children.


