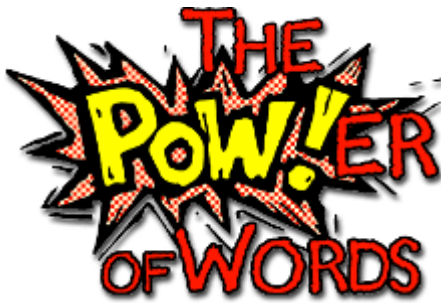

holidays any more so the school holidays became longer and more standardized, allowing families to spend the holidays together. Travelling together to another place for holidays only became common in the 20th century.

Following another arduous journey back, they arrived tired but with lots of tales to tell. Well done Year 6 on a successful trip and for such great behaviour!

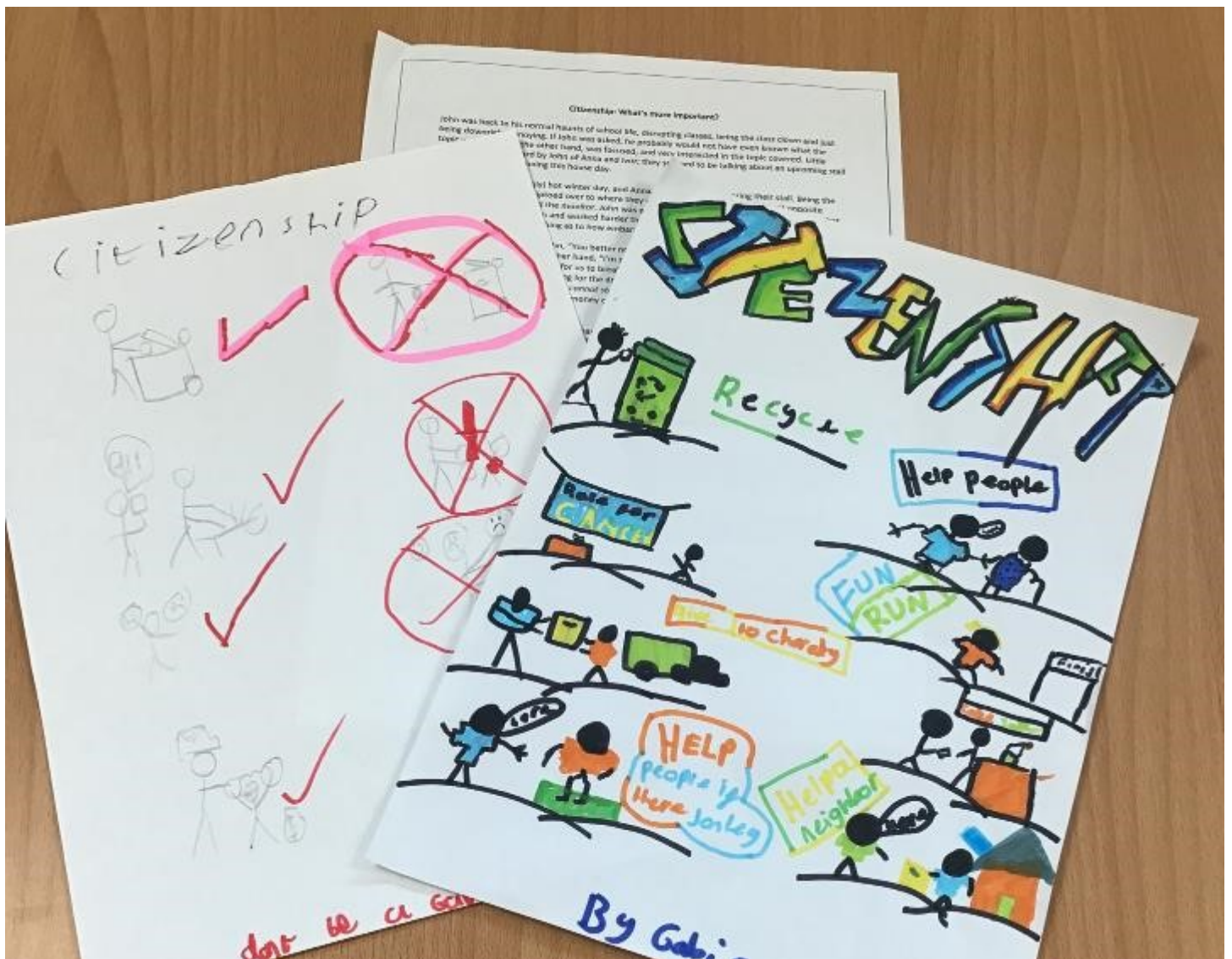

Year 11 Leavers BBQ Event

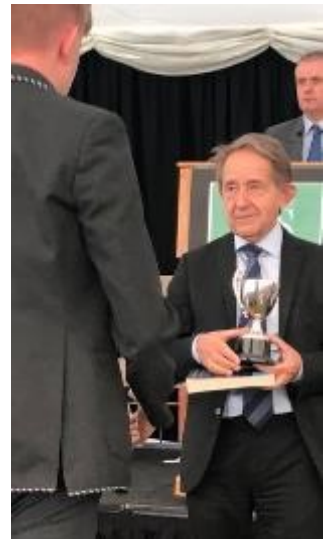
Our Year 11 pupils and their families returned to school on Tuesday evening to enjoy a BBQ with staff and a final farewell.

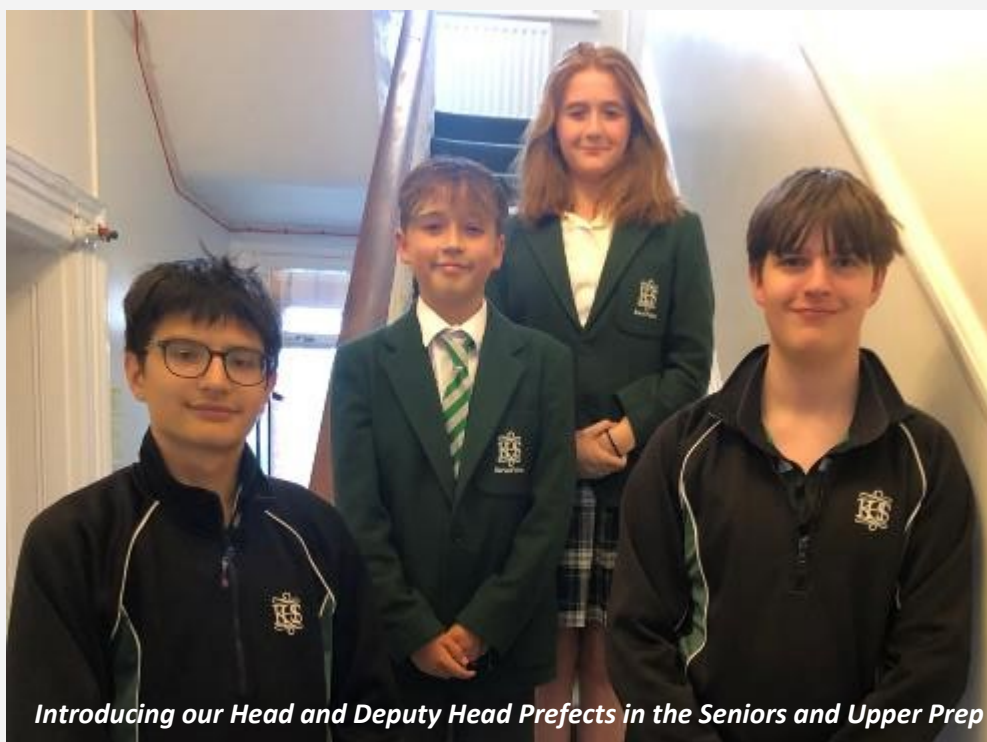
