Congratulations—Youth Football

Mr Cowie, and school, were delighted to learn of a pupil in 9P, Bastie, who was selected to play in an U13 team based in Surrey, that went to the Gothia Youth World Cup in Gothenburg, Sweden in July.

The opening ceremony of the tournament was attended by over 50,000 spectators which would have made for an exhilarating experience out on the pitch!

There were 194 U13 boys teams competing from

27 nations. Bastie was his team's leading goal scorer with 3 goals and in one of the games he won 'Man of the Match'.

His team not only topped their group, they also made it to the last 32 of the tournament, which was an incredible achievement .

Bastie's team was coached by Danny Murphy, ex-Liverpool, Fulham and England International, *see right*.

Mr Cowie is hoping to see Bastie's experience of this tournament being brought to the KHS pitch this term and shared with his peers and team mates.

Year 7 – 11 PSHE Workshops

The organisation '<u>One Chance'</u> helps spread awareness regarding county lines criminal activity and provides guidance and support for children, young adults and those working in the education sector . As with all the workshops we offer our pupils, it is not to frighten them and get them thinking they can not go out, socialise online and have fun, both in the real world and online, but to educate and highlight to them the relevant issues so they are aware and can make informed choices. The sessions were very well received by our pupils in Years 7-11

Most of the time, children and young adults are coerced or groomed by someone even before they realise they are victims of county lines criminality and exploitation. Unfortunately this criminality and exploitation can take many forms, and escalate quickly to involve serious violence, sexual assault and drug trafficking. The sessions made pupils aware of this and provided them with the chance to ask questions, listen to Emma and Lee who have a wealth of experience in the area and equip them with knowledge to spot the signs, understand the risks and keep themselves safe. It was a very positive day for staff and pupils alike.
