### Tooled Up platform—a note for Parents...

If you have been signed up to our free online platform of various resources under the umbrella, Tooled Up, they have emailed users directly informing them about some improvements and changes they have made to their main site. They comment,



"Our Tooled Up platform has recently undergone a complete overhaul to significantly improve the service that we provide. To log into your account you no longer need to enter a password as we have installed Magic Link technology for your convenience and improved security. To log into your account:

Go to the Tooled Up page on the Kingswood House school website <u>here</u>, enter your email address then click the 'Send Magic Link' button.

Check your email and click on the 'Sign In' button to gain instant access to our evidence-based resource platform. Other changes we've made that you may notice are:

New User Interface: If you joined Tooled Up before 11th September 2023, then once logged in, our site will look different to what you are used to and the web address of all of our resources and 'members-only' pages now start with "https://members.tooledupeducation.com"

Finding what you need: We have changed the search engine used on our site and combined the quick search, browse, advanced search and index functions all into one single view. This change has been applied to increase the speed and accuracy of the results being returned. We hope you find the site more valuable than ever".











Pippa is going to be playing the part of a child and also is part of the puppetry team playing and voicing the Giant.


It's a production for the community, children and giants alike but especially those aged 4-10. It's shaping up to be a really lovely adaptation celebrating children's power to change the world.



# BEING A POSITIVE BYSTANDER: SCENARIOS TO TALK THROUGH WITH TEENS

# Scenario 1

Patrick is chatting with three of his friends when the conversation turns to a girl they all know in their year at school. Two of them say how annoying they find her and then one of them comments that she's a bit of a 'slut'. Once before, Patrick challenged his friends on this kind of thing and they just laughed and told him to lighten up. What can Patrick do? What might make it hard? What could he try?





# Scenario 2

Fauzaan is at a party with his friend Michael who sees a girl from school who has fallen asleep after too many drinks. Michael laughs and takes a picture of her before posting it on Snapchat. What can Fauzaan do? What makes his choices more difficult? How might he overcome these challenges?

# Scenario 3

Joanna is trying a new activity with a group of her oldest friends. They visit a climbing wall. Whilst there, Joanna hears a friend make a homophobic comment about one of the instructors. The other friends don't hear it. What can/should she say or do?





# Scenario 4

Mark attends the prom with a group of school friends. One of his friends drinks too much alcohol and is intoxicated. Whilst drunk, he stumbles across another teen at the party and grabs their hand pulling them into the garden. The teen clearly doesn't want to go and is tugging in the opposite direction. What can/should Mark do to intervene?



As part of *Anti-Bullying Week* in school our lovely ELSA Miss Timothy has suggested resources to the classes that can be used as part of their PSHE learning and Form Time this week... the information above asks pupils to think about how they can be a positive bystander, nudging them to call out behaviours that they don't agree with and acknowledging that standing up for others can be tough, but worth it. This links in nicely with the theme this year which is 'Make A Noise About Bullying'.


They showed great control in placing the thread and thinking about the outline of the shape they wanted to achieve.


