

This is open to all students and students must complete one of the British Science week projects on the theme of 'Time' in order to be invited on the trip.



Students in Years 2 – 6 could complete either the disappearing dinos,

get set jellies, making a pendulum timer, communicate to protect, design a farm of the future, nature's future, time travelling programmers, making biodegradable plastic or poster project on the theme of 'Time' here:

Students in Years 7-11 could complete the projects on making a rollercoaster faster, plant growth and nutrients, sustainable transport futures, history of the universe, how much rain, how to accurately measure time, making a time chamber (magnifying glass required) or a poster project on the theme of 'Time' here:
