

Ivan T (11H) I had the pleasure of listening in to Ivan's LAMDA lesson, he read the text brilliantly! Miss Hylands


Henry S (11H) is working so hard on his Drama performance, read really well. Miss Hylands

The teachers' table won and knocked the reigning parent group off the top spot. It was a very close call between the Year 10 and 7 parents' as well. Good effort everyone that came along!











A letter from our incoming Head, Matthew Bryan (Parentmailed to you this week)

Dear Parents and Guardians

It really is a pleasure and a privilege to be writing my first letter to you – still a little premature, but spring is in the air and I'm counting down the days until the summer term starts!

There are two reasons to be writing to you: firstly, I would like to announce that Liam Clarke, who has done such a great job these past two terms as Interim Head, has accepted the role of Deputy Head at Kingswood House, effective from the summer term. It is testament to the whole of the school staff, and especially the SLT, that the school has run so well since the retirement of Ian Mitchell late last year, but it is now time to put the correct management structures in place as we look forward to an exciting future. On a personal note, I have hugely enjoyed working with Liam since last summer and look forward to this continuing. Staff were informed yesterday, and the delighted response from the common room speaks volumes about the regard in which Liam is held by colleagues.

My second purpose is to thank you all for your feedback, honesty and engagement with the various surveys and requests for thoughts that have gone out in recent times. I have been keen to hear from you, from the pupils and also from all the staff about your feelings regarding this marvellous school as it settles into its 125th year.
